Strategic Purpose statement/ Te rautaki o te tohu

This qualification is intended for people working in or entering the swimming pool building industry. It recognises the skills and knowledge required to plan, prepare, and carry out swimming pool building that are fit-for-purpose, durable, and aligned with environmental and legislative requirements.

The optional strands in above-ground swimming pool, concrete swimming pool, fibre-glass swimming pool, and pre-cast swimming pool recognise specialised skills required in some settings of the swimming pool building industry

Graduates will be able to work unsupervised to the required technical, safety, quality and productivity standards expected of a competent swimming pool builder.
